FINAL TIPS & TAKEAWAYS

- Start your college application and essay early! Don't wait until the last minute!
 - Check your portal regularly and ensure you have done all the steps (apply, supplementals, honors application, SSAR, SPARK, CSS, etc.)
 - Create a "College Application email" This way you won't lose track of dates, deadlines, and updates!
 - Look into scholarships! There are so many that are simple and not heavily applied for
 - Ask for help! Consult guidance or previous seniors who know the process
 - Save supplemental essays to a drive, you can tweak and reuse them!
 - Keep a record of all achievements and awards so you can easily recall them
- Sophomores!!!
- Get involved!!
 - Keep grades up
 - Take challenging courses
 - Start preparing for big tests (SAT, ACT, CLT) There are so many practice materials you can use, take advantage of that!

COLLEGE ADMISSIONS TIMELINE

- If you haven't already, sign up for the SAT and/or ACT. CLT is another option, although not as widely accepted by colleges.
- Continue researching colleges and organize a list of schools to which you plan to apply
- Begin application process as soon as possible
- Complete career interest inventories if unsure of college major
- Complete FAFSA as soon as possible starting Oct. 1st!

- ▶The ACT & SAT are offered on various Saturdays throughout the year, at multiple high schools in Hillsborough county. The CLT is not offered at any HCPS sites for weekend, college reportable testing. Upon registration for that exam, students would elect to take it with a remote proctor or at home with a parent proctor.
- ▶Fee Waivers ([Alternative Income Verification Form](#)) 2 SAT waivers: should be in your collegeboard account & 4 ACT waivers)
- ▶Request waivers via the SAT & ACT Waivers Form found in the Guidance module of your Bloomingdale high school resources class or at bloomingdaleguidance.org under the “request forms” tab

*As for CLT, click on the link for the “financial assistance request form” at cltexam.com

–must submit no later than 2 weeks before the registration deadline for the exam

–you can submit 2 requests per year

–If approved, a unique discount code (up to the full amount) will be sent to the email listed on your CLT student account and you can use that code when you sign up for the test.

COLLEGE ADMISSIONS

- Fill out one application and send it to multiple schools
 - Common App
 - www.commonapp.com

*New this year, if utilizing Common App, you will link your Common App to your Xello account!

COLLEGE ADMISSIONS

- Getting Organized
 - Compare relevant information side by side
 - Look for the freshman application checklist
 - Use a calendar or planner to keep track of deadlines
(online calendars are an amazing tool to help keep you on track...make it a habit of putting all important dates in there as soon as you know them...include personal, work, school, extra currics, etc...)

COLLEGE APPLICATIONS: WHAT TO EXPECT

- Student data
- Student essay
- Supplemental forms
 - Official transcript
 - SAT/ACT scores
 - School report/counselor rec.
 - Teacher rec.
 - Mid-year school report
 - Final transcript (this won't be due as part of the application...you won't even request these until April)
- Application fee (fee waivers-collegeboard, ACT, & NACAC)

COLLEGE APPLICATIONS

- Letters of Recommendation
 - Minimum 2 weeks notice
 - Resume or info sheet
 - Teacher, counselor, coach, or mentor (think about your major, ie: STEM major? Should ask a math or science teacher)
- Transcripts
 - Sdhc.scriborder.com
 - Send electronically through Commonapp, Coalition App, or SendEdu
- Interviews
 - Location, time, date
 - Who will be conducting the interview?

COLLEGE ADMISSIONS DECISION MODELS

- Regular Decision (seats fill up...be careful)
 - Set application deadline in the Fall
 - Not happy with test scores? Should I still apply now? Test optional?
 - Notified of decision by a specified date – usually in March or April
- Rolling Admission
 - No set deadline. Once the school receives all of your application material, they will notify you within a matter of days or weeks.

COLLEGE ADMISSIONS DECISION MODELS

- Early Decision
 - Apply early (usually by October or November)
 - Receive admissions decision well in advance of the usual notification date
 - Early decision plans are “binding”, meaning if you apply early decision, you agree to attend the college if they accept you
 - You can only apply to one college early decision, but you may apply to other colleges regular decision
 - If you’re accepted under early decision, you must withdraw all other applications

COLLEGE ADMISSIONS DECISION MODELS

- Should you apply Early Decision?
 - Yes, if:
 - You are very sure of the college you want to attend
 - Your stats (GPA, test scores, etc.) match or almost match those of the average accepted student
 - Financial aid is not a concern
 - No, if:
 - You plan to weigh financial aid offers from multiple schools
 - You're considering several colleges

COLLEGE ADMISSIONS DECISION MODELS

- Early Action
 - Application is due early and you get an admission decision in the winter or early spring
 - Non-binding
 - You can apply early action to multiple schools, or apply to one school early action and other schools regular decision
- Note a big change for UCF this year! Previously they were only rolling admission. Now they have implemented an early action deadline.

BRIGHT FUTURES SCHOLARSHIP

- Bright Futures awards four different scholarships:
 - Academic
 - Medallion
 - Gold Seal
 - CAPE
- GPAs are recalculated using only your academic courses
 - 4 English, 4 Math, 3 Science, 3 Social Studies, 2 Foreign Language
- Add .5 points for weighted classes

BRIGHT FUTURES SCHOLARSHIP

- Academic Scholars (100% tuition paid)
 - 1330 SAT or 29 ACT or 95 CLT
 - 100 volunteer hours/paid work hours
 - 3.5 weighted GPA
- Medallion Scholars (75% tuition paid)
 - 1190 SAT or 24 ACT or 82 CLT
 - 75 volunteer hours or 100 paid work hours, or a combination of volunteer hours and paid work hours totaling 100 hours
 - 3.0 weighted GPA

BRIGHT FUTURES STATUS

- Check your Bright Futures eligibility on your BF report you will receive twice a year (Sept. & Feb.)
- Displays your academic GPA, highest test scores, and community service once hours have been submitted
